# Walking in the Light

## A 3-Day Mini Devotional

**This short devotional is designed to help you slow down and sit with the opening chapter of the Gospel of John. John 1 reveals not only who Jesus is, but what His presence means for our daily lives. Each day invites you to reflect, pray, and respond as you walk in the light of Christ.**

# Day 1: The Word Who Was With God

**Scripture Reading: John 1:1-3**

“In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.”

Before anything existed, Jesus was already there. John begins his Gospel by lifting our eyes beyond time and creation and pointing us to eternity.

Jesus was not created. He did not come into existence when He was born on earth. He has always been with the Father, fully divine, active, and present.

This truth reminds us that our faith is not built on a fragile foundation. Jesus is eternal. He stands outside of time, yet He steps into it. When life feels uncertain or unstable, John 1 anchors us in the reality that Jesus has always been in control.

Because Jesus existed before all things, we can trust Him with all things. Our circumstances may change, but He does not. He is the same yesterday, today, and forever.

## REFLECTION QUESTION

Where do you need to invite the light of Christ into your life today?

## PRAYER

“Jesus, you are the light that darkness cannot overcome. Shine Your light into the places where I feel afraid, uncertain, or weary. Help me trust that You are working even when I cannot see it.

Amen.



# Day 2: The Light That Overcomes Darkness

Scripture Reading: John 1:4-5

“In Him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.”

Darkness is real. John does not deny that. He acknowledges fear, sin, pain, and separation from God. But he also reminds us of something greater: darkness has limits.

## REFLECTION QUESTION

Where do you need to invite the light of Christ into your life today?

## PRAYER

Jesus, you are the light that darkness cannot overcome. Shine Your light into the places where I feel afraid, uncertain, or weary. Help me trust that You are working even when I cannot see it.

Amen.

Jesus is the light, and light cannot be overcome by darkness. Even when darkness appeared to win at the cross, it did not have the final word. Jesus defeated sin through His death and rose again in victory. What looked like defeat was actually triumph.

This truth matters for our everyday lives. When we feel overwhelmed, discouraged, or lost, we are reminded that darkness does not define the end of the story. Jesus does.



# Day 3: The Word Who Came Near

Scripture Reading: John 1:14

“The Word became flesh and made His dwelling among us.”

John 1 reaches its heart when we read that the Word became flesh. God did not remain distant. He chose to come near. Jesus entered the world He created and lived among His people.

Jesus understands human weakness because He lived it. He experienced hunger, fatigue, rejection, sorrow, and pain. He is not distant from our struggles because He has walked through them Himself.


## PRAYER

Jesus, thank You for coming near and dwelling among us. Thank You for understanding my pain and meeting me where I am. Help me walk closely with You and trust Your presence in my life each day. Amen.

This means our faith is not rooted in ideas or traditions alone. It is rooted in a Savior who knows us fully and loves us completely. Walking with Jesus means walking with someone who understands us and invites us into relationship, not distance.

## REFLECTION QUESTION

Where do you need to invite the light of Christ into your life today?

As you finish this devotional, remember that John 1 is an invitation. It invites us to believe, to trust, and to walk in the light of Christ. Jesus is the eternal Word, the victorious Light, and the Savior who came near. May His light continue to guide your steps.
